CALCULATION OF PRORATED REFUND. The refund shall be calculated as follows: 1. Deducting the registration fee of \$150.00 from the total cost of training 2. Dividing the tuition by the number of hours in the program.
 The quotient is the hourly charge for the program. The amount owed by the student for the purposes of calculating a refund is derived by multiplying the total hours attended by the hourly charge for instruction.
5. The refund will be any amount in excess that was paid by the student's third-party. TUITION REFUNDS AND CREDIT: The Institution shall pay or credit refunds due within 45 days following the date upon which the student
withdrawal has been determined. MATERIALS AND TOOLS: The student must return the equipment in good condition, allowing for reasonable wear and tear, within 45 days follow.
